

# Beginner's Toolkit: Trumpet

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# :16 Holding the Trumpet

## -Left Hand

- -Grab the valve casing with your left hand
- -Put your left ring finger in the 3<sup>rd</sup> valve slide ring
- -Put your left thumb in the 1st valve slide saddle, if included on your trumpet
- -Keep your left hand wrist straight

#### -Right Hand

- -Put your right thumb between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> valve casings
- -Place the pointer, middle, and ring fingers on the valves
- -Put your pinky on top of the pinky ring, to NOT pull on the ring toward your face
- -Keep as little tension in the right hand as possible
- -Make a backwards C shape with your hand to use the tips of the fingers on the valves

#### 3:46 Embouchure and Buzzing

- Correct embouchure and mouthpiece placement are key for good success
  - -Correct mouthpiece placement is important for tone, range, and endurance
  - -The setup must be correct from the start to build a good habit

### -Buzzing

- -Make an "Mmm" sound with the lips rolled in a bit
- -Creates firmness around the lips for correct embouchure
- -Make an "Mmm" shape and blow air over the lips, like making a "Poo" sound
- -Make an "Mmm" shape and blow air across to then vibrate the lips

#### 7:18 Mouthpiece Placement

- -The horizontal placement varies by player because of teeth
- The vertical placement is more important
- -The inner edge on the top of the *mouthpiece rim* must be above the fleshy part of the lips -Keep the bottom lip as flat as possible
  - -This helps make an anchor point
  - -The bottom lip can withstand pressure
  - -Keep the Trumpet angled slightly down
